- **Calligraphy** art of beautiful writing using letters of a distinct consistent style such as Chancery, Gothic, Script, etc. or of an original design. Lettering may be done with a lettering pen, brush, steel brush, or felt tip markers made for caligraphy. No stencils.
- **Crafts** Crafts can be anything three dimensional that is not strictly a sculpture or a textile.
- **Monochromatic Drawing** drawing using shades of only one color. Students may use ink, pencil, charcoal, etc., or a combination of these.
- **Polychromatic Drawing** uses more than one color. The student may use pastels, crayons, colored pencils, felt tip markers, etc. "Puff" paints probably would belong to this category because the main element is line. A combination of these mediums is acceptable.
- **Oil Painting** Oil paint and appropriate solvents must be used. Acceptable grounds include, but are not limited to canvas, wood, and assorted art boards. Use of an air brush is permitted. The work must be completely dry before being submitted.
- **Acrylic Painting** Paints must be acrylic polymers. Acceptable grounds include, but are not limited to, canvas, wood, and assorted art boards. Additional substances may be used for textural effects, as long as the surface of the work remains paint. Use of an air brush is permitted. The work must be completely dry before being submitted.
- **Still Life and Macro Photography** Still Life photography is a grouping of small objects placed in arrangement by human design in a pleasing composition. Macro photography is an extreme close-up of a subject at a magnification of life-size or larger.
- **Landscape & Architecture Photography** Landscape photography is an area of scenery that is extensive and seen from a single viewpoint, such as a picture defining natural inland or coastal scenery. Architecture photography is of manmade buildings and structures.
- **People & Animals Photography** People photography is of an individual or group that is the **main subject** in the composition. It may be posed or candid. Animal photography is of animals in their captive or natural setting. This category does not mean it has to have an animal entry and a people entry.
- **Printmaking** Printmaking is a design or picture carved or etched into one surface, then inked and transferred to another surface. Linoleum block, woodcut, etching, drypoint, collagraph, and silkscreen, as well as "potato prints," belong to this category. Scratch art will be considered etching. The original carved or etched surface must be presented.
- **Sculpture** Sculpture is the art of carving (subtracting), modeling (shaping), or welding (combining) to produce a form in three dimensions or relief. The creation must be of original design, not from a kit.
- **Textiles** Textiles covers the creating of a piece of art using fibers or cloth. Macramé is the artful weaving of cords using a variety of knots. Appliqué uses cut out shapes of cloth and attaches them to a background fabric. Needlework includes candlewicking, embroidery, cross-stitch, needlepoint, crewel, crochet, and knitting.
- **Watercolors** Watercolor is a piece of art using (generally) transparent color in a water base. The paper used may be wet (wash) or dry when the paint is applied. Any water-based media, such as watercolor, gouache, or tempera, may be used.
- Mixed Media A two-dimensional or three-dimensional item using a combination of mediums, such as paint and pencil, etc.
- **Woodworking** All production procedures must be done totally by the student and may have adult supervision. No kits are permitted. Maximum size is to be 40 cubic feet. Basic carpentry/cabinet making projects. Original design and simple mechanical drawing must be included with project.

## Feel free to email me with any questions you have.

On Wednesdays (by appointment after school), the art room can be open for students to ask questions, get advice, or possibly work on their projects, but the majority of the project should be completed at home. **Appointments** can be requested via email (**lware@gracelions.com**).

Junior High students are working in art classes on their presentation and critiquing skills and will have some of their artwork on display during the Grace Festival. It is my goal for all of the 7th and 8th grade students to sign up for at least one art category in fine arts.
